COURSE GOALS

- i. Cultural/Historical – Students will investigate the content and aesthetics of the arts within cultural, historical, and contemporary contexts and understand the connection between the arts and the human experience.
- ii. Critical/Responsive – Students will respond to artistic expressions of Saskatchewan, Canadian, and international artists using critical thinking, research, creativity, and collaborative inquiry.
- iii. Creative/Productive – Students will inquire, create, and communicate through visual art.

STUDENT LEARNING OUTCOMES:

- i. Analyze forms of art from a variety of cultures and societies, historical and contemporary; interpret meanings within appropriate contexts; and relate their understanding to their own expressions and life experiences.
(Focus: cultural/Historical Component)
- ii. Use analytical and critical thought to respond to art works and infer meanings based on the many contexts of visual art and global issues (Focus: Critical/Responsive Component)
- iii. Initiate and develop ideas for art-making, transpose these ideas into art forms using a variety of media, and reflect upon their processes and their completed works within the contexts of visual art.
(Focus: Creative/Productive Component)
